The Week Ahead



This is the end of Easter Season for 2011 – the Solemnity of Pentecost! It ranks as the third most important feast of the liturgical year: first is Easter and second is Christmas.

This feast is also called the ‘birthday’ of the Church – in the sense that the church began to grow on this day. One could say that the church was in a ‘gestation’ period for the whole time that Jesus was training the apostles – almost three years. But, it became an independent living, breathing (with the Holy Spirit) body on Pentecost and the initial growth was phenomenal: 3000 persons asked to be baptized on Pentecost Day because of the eloquent and convincing speech of Peter after he was filled with the Holy Spirit

The real challenge of this feast of Pentecost is to once again invite the Holy Spirit into our lives that we might be renewed and filled with new courage and determination to live lives of strong Christian witness: we need to be ‘on fire’ with Christian zeal and enthusiasm. As the apostles were changed and ‘fired up’ with the Holy Spirit, we need to experience that same excitement and bring the love and compassion of God to others! How will you change? What change can you bring to your home, your neighborhood, your workplace?

So, we return tomorrow, June 13, to Ordinary Time. Unfortunately, in the English language the word “ordinary” seems to signify ‘routine, rut, boring’; but the word “ordinary” comes from a Latin word “*ordo*”, which means ‘order’. In other words, we have been trying to put our lives ‘in order’ since Ash Wednesday – 96 days ago! Now, that we have completed these special seasons of pre-Lent, Lent, Triduum and Easter, we enter this lengthy season of Ordinary Time – a time to put into practice the ‘re-ORDERing’ of our lives. How different are you from the person that started Ash Wednesday on March 9?

Baptism of older children *How do I enroll my child?*

Elementary Registration for 2011/12 year Grades 1-5 will begin July 5 in the Religious Ed Office M-F 8:00 am - 4:00 pm. A BAPTISM CERTIFICATE is required for each child being registered.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Family must be registered at Christ the King
- Family must be worshipping at Christ the King at our weekend liturgy
- Past due balances from the previous Religious Education year must be paid prior to registering

When are classes held?

Classes are held on Wednesdays at either 4:30 or 6:00 pm

Fees:

- Religious Education Classes \$75.00 per child.
- First Holy Communion \$125.00 per child.
- Full Initiation \$150.00 per child.

\$25 non-refundable deposit is required to register. Payment plans are available.

SACRAMENTS

(1st Communion, Baptism)

REQUIREMENTS:

- Same as for Religious Education Registration plus:
- Child is in second grade or above
- Child is enrolled in and attending weekly age-level Religious Education classes on a regular basis
- Unbaptized children must attend one full year of Religious Education first

Our sacrament preparation is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and a parent or guardian in monthly sessions.

Attendance at these sessions is mandatory.
