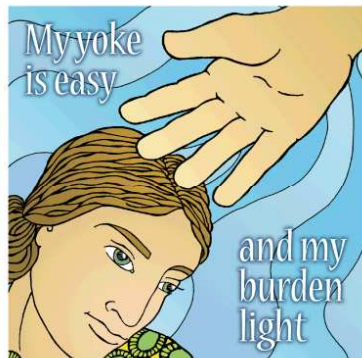

SHARE THE BURDEN

“Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest” (Matthew 11:28). These words of our Savior seem to be in stark contrast to the previous chapter from the same Gospel, when we were told that if we do not take up our crosses, we are not worthy of Christ. Connecting these two messages might help us on our faith journeys. Being a follower of Christ surely means that we must embrace

the cross, in its mystery of both suffering and triumph. This is something that we need not do alone, for the burden is often too heavy for us to carry by ourselves. Who, then, do we turn to? We can turn to the Body of Christ—the community of disciples gathered for worship. When we find the burden too heavy, let us remember that we can share that burden with our Christian sisters and brothers, who can help bring us rest.

The Week Ahead



“It’s summertime and the living is easy . . .” — so goes the song from the musical *Porgy & Bess*. And, that’s exactly what summer should be all about: slowing down, relaxing, spending quality time with family and friends, traveling, vacationing, picnicking, swimming, biking, fishing, hiking, camping, movie going, Spring

Mountain Ranch Summer Theater, Utah Shakespearean Theater in Cedar City, Disneyland, Magic Mountain, Knott’s Berry Farm, Lake Mead boating and water skiing, Pacific Ocean beaches, Mount Charleston, Big Bear, Lake Arrowhead and Lake Tahoe. (Hope you got a few ideas — and will try some of them out this summer!)

Summer? When does it really start? Well, in southern Nevada, we usually get 100°+ heat in May (although this year May was unusually cool!); officially summer began this year on Tuesday, June 21, at 10:16 a.m. (PDT); but for many “summer” kicks in at high gear on the Fourth of July weekend — this weekend with a three-day holiday: Saturday, Sunday and Monday!

So, enjoy the benefits of summer! Many of our programs here at Christ the King take a break as well! It’s a time to evaluate the past and make plans for the future. I plan to schedule some dates in July or August for adults to learn how to join the Catholic Church or how to return to Catholicism. Check this bulletin in the future for more information.

Please don’t forget to support Christ the King during the summer months. Our bills continue to come in on a regular basis (summer or not!) and some are actually higher because of air conditioning. The fiscal year ended on June 30 and I will publish an “end of the year report” in the next several weeks along with the budget for Fiscal Year 2011/2012. If you’re going to be out of town for a weekend, why not make your parish offering/tithe BEFORE you leave? This will be a big help to our financial picture. What a great time to start “e-tithing”! Go to www.ctlv.org and click on “Give Now”. We ended the year just \$7,000.00 under budget — not bad for recession time: that translates to about \$135.00 less per weekend than budgeted (\$7,000.00 divided by 52 weeks = \$134.61). So, if each contributor gave just \$1.00 more per week or \$4.00 or \$5.00 more per months, we would be on budget for this next year. Please consider doing so. If you have had a salary increase of any kind in the last 12 months, can you pass some of that on to CTK? Thanks.

Finally, our office will be closed on Fridays at 12:00 noon during July and August: a “Summer” gift to our staff and maybe a little Saving\$ on A/C?!

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Changing the face of Religious Education



I would like to welcome you to the Atrium! For many of you this word is foreign, but has its roots in Italy over 50 years ago. A gentle kind theologian was asked by Maria Montessori to shepherd a child in study of the bible. In the beginning not at all comfortable with children, Sophia Cavaletti accepted the challenge, with the help of Gianna Gobbi, and has brought the program to where it is today. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is all over the world! Sofia at 92 is still an integral part of the process.

This “gift” has been brought to Christ the King, and is steadily growing in numbers. It is a unique approach to teaching the child. We put the means in front of the child and with the help of the Holy Spirit the child comes to God – by themselves. In a traditional religious education room children are given a workbook, a craft, information and a snack. In the atrium we use only the bible and those books that you will find at mass.

The atrium is built on two pillars:

The Mass

The Bible

So in that context we have certain areas we focus on. In the Level I atrium we begin to ground the children with the most essential aspects of the mass. How to prepare the altar, what are the articles used in baptism, why are there different colors used in the mass – why is the priests chasuble green? We learn the gestures of the mass epiclesis, offering, the breaking of the bread, and the sign of peace.

We ground them in the bible - beginning with geography so that when we work on the “Infancy Narratives” we know of the land that Jesus walked; he was a real person in a real time. We work with parables of the Kingdom of God. We begin to understand the prayer that Jesus taught us to pray “The Lord’s Prayer”.

Through the use of the Good Shepherd we will come to find out about the Eucharistic Presence at the mass. That is our linking point – we are the sheep that are gathered around the altar. The Good Shepherd still takes care of us all, giving us the best food and the best drink.

In Level II all of the above is built on and more is added. We come to understand that there has always been a plan in the mind of God. We delve into creation, redemption and into parousia. We open the bible and we intimately know the books and the sections. We know prophecies, prophets and then we add to the Kingdom of God parables with Moral Parables. Our geography is bigger as to begin to really understand the “Paschal Mystery” of Christ.

As part of Eucharistic Preparation we pick apart the mass. We will come to know the order and the prayer, the rites and responses, the gestures and the language. We have much bigger works. If the child has not had Level I that is OK because through the schooling the catechist’s have had, we know how to get them up to speed.

It is important for you to remember as parents that the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program is different than the traditional religious education:

Level I – for ages 3-6, it is a three year program (you need to register every year still.)

Level II – for ages 6-9, this is also a three year program (six is a transition age; Level II also requires yearly registration.)

REQUIREMENTS:

- Family must be registered at Christ the King
- Family must be worshipping at Christ the King at our weekend liturgy
- Past due balances from the previous Religious Education year must be paid prior to registering

When are classes held?

Fees:

- Religious Education Classes \$75.00 per child.
