GOOD SEEDS



Today Jesus continues to speak to his followers using parables. What a rich treasure we are given today in three parables about the kingdom of heaven! The kingdom is likened to a man sowing good seed in his field, a mustard seed, and yeast mixed with flour. As they did last week, today the disciples press Jesus for an interpretation of one of the parables—the parable of the man sowing good seed. Lest we think that these parables are simply amusing little anecdotes, Jesus' interpretation should be seen for what it is—a warning. Wailing and grinding of teeth in a fiery furnace await those who are children of the evil one. This parable points to the struggle for today's

believer. Sometimes, through sin, we sow weeds and prevent the love of Christ from blossoming. Let today's Gospel help put us back on track. Let us recommit ourselves to prepare for the last days, the harvest, by blossoming as the good seeds we were created in love to be.

Hoy Jesús continua hablando en parábolas con sus seguidores. ¡Qué rico tesoro nos regalan las tres parábolas sobre el Reino de los cielos! Al igual que la semana pasada, hoy los discípulo piden que Jesús les interprete una de las parábolas – la parábola del hombre que siembra buena semilla. Para que no pensemos que estas parábolas son simples anécdotas entretenidas, la interpretación de Jesús debe considerarse como lo que es – una advertencia. Llanto y desesperación esperan a los hijos del maligno. Esta parábola señala la lucha del creyente de hoy. A veces, por el pecado, sembramos cizaña y evitamos que el amor de Cristo florezca. Que el Evangelio de hoy nos ayude a retornar al buen camino. I have some exciting news for the parish. We are bringing to CTK the very popular, successful and challenging program entitled **CHRIST RENEWS HIS PARISH** — often abbreviated to **CHRP** (from the underlined letters in the FULL name above) and it is often even abbreviated in conversation as “*chirp*” !!! **CHRP** is a spiritual renewal weekend designed to help individuals grow in their personal relationship with Jesus Christ and with others in their faith community. It is an excellent opportunity for Catholics to renew their understanding of the basic beliefs and traditions of their faith. **CHRP** is a process designed to bring members of a parish together in Christ. Just as all of our other communities need renewal, so does our commitment to Christ if we're to be faithful followers. **CHRP** is an effective spiritual renewal that call together members of the parish to experience personal conversion and Christian community within the environment of Christ the King Catholic Community. **CHRP** is NOT a silent retreat, a public confession, emotional cult or clique! During the weekend, you will listen to a number of individuals who have volunteered to give a personal witness to the power of Jesus Christ in their lives. Group discussions, usually made of 4-5 people, and responses, follow each presentation. Most in-depth discussions take place amongst your own table. You'll be free to share as much or as little as you feel comfortable. There will be reading of Scripture, time for prayer, and time set aside for personal reflection. You and your needs will always be respected. The sharing dialogue is stimulated in a very liturgical, scriptural and prayerful atmosphere. Sacraments are in integral part of the weekend. There will be an opportunity to go to confession and the weekend will conclude with a Mass. All experiences shared on the weekend are confidential, unless otherwise expressed by the participants.

The “first-ever” CHRP weekend is for WOMEN and is scheduled for Saturday/Sunday, September 17/18. A team from Toledo, Ohio is presenting the initial weekend. All are welcome; but space is limited. MISSION APPEALS

Bishop Mylo Vergara and Fr. Manny Guico from the Diocese of San Jose, Nueva Ecija, Philippines will conduct the Mission Appeals at Christ the King Catholic Community, Las Vegas, Nevada on the weekend of August 6-7, 2011. The Diocese of San Jose (created and established on February 16, 1984) is located approximately 160 kilometers from Manila. The total population is around 699,043 whose inhabitants speak two dialects - Talalog and Ilokano. It is mostly an agricultural community with poor tenant-farmers producing rice, corn, onions, fruits and vegetables. Last September 2009, two big typhoons devastated the rice crops of many poor farmers. There are also indigenous communities (tribal natives groups) scattered in far flung villages in this ecclesiastical territory. Eighty percent are Roman Catholics who are served and ministered by 21 diocesan priests. Around 10 religious priests from 4 congregations and approximately 50 religious sisters from 7 different religious congregations help out in diverse ministries and apostolates of the diocese. In order to support and sustain their pastoral programs and evangelization activities, the diocese will rely and depend on your generosity and financial support.

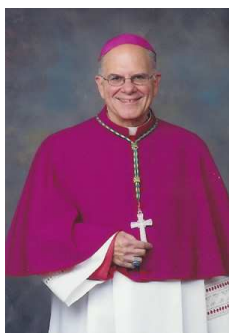

REQUIREMENTS:

- Family must be registered at Christ the King
- Family must be worshipping at Christ the King at our weekend liturgy
- Past due balances from the previous Religious Education year must be paid prior to registering

When are classes held?

Classes are held on Wednesdays at either 4:30 or 6:00 pm

Fees:

- Religious Education Classes \$75.00 per child.
- First Holy Communion \$125.00 per child.
- Full Initiation \$150.00 per child.

\$25 non-refundable deposit is required to register. Payment plans are available.

SACRAMENTS

(1st Communion, Baptism)

REQUIREMENTS:

- Same as for Religious Education Registration plus:

- Unbaptized children must attend one full year of Religious Education first

Our sacrament preparation is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and a parent or guardian in monthly sessions.
