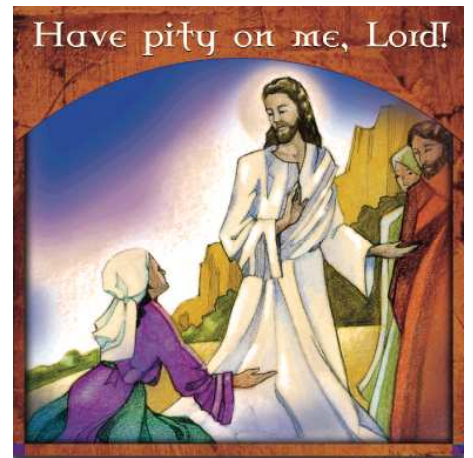

WHY PRAY?

The "foreigners" as Isaiah calls them, the "Gentiles" as Paul calls them, or the "Canaanites" as Matthew calls them are called to worship the one true God in prayer. As we listen to today's readings, perhaps we are tempted to ask: Why pray? The question is rhetorical; it is tantamount to asking why should friends talk to one another or people in love kiss one another. Prayer is a way of relating to God, a way of talking to God. The apostles had the opportunity to talk to Jesus in the flesh. We have the opportunity to talk to Jesus Christ in prayer. Our relationship with him must be enthusiastic; it cannot be faint-hearted. John Donne, a fifteenth-century poet, knew what the qualities of good prayer were. Donne asks God to treat him differently from most Christians. The poet does not want God to merely "knock, breathe, shine, and seek to mend," but also to "break, blow, burn, and make me new" (*Holy Sonnets*, XIV).

It takes a dynamic faith on our part to come to God in prayer. As Jesus once said, "Knock and the door will be opened to you" (Matthew 7:7). It may take pounding the door down, but if we are as persistent as the woman in today's Gospel, the results will follow. © Copyright, J. S. Paluch Co.

¿POR QUÉ REZAR?

¡Señor, ten compasión de mí!

Los "extranjeros" que Isaías menciona, los "gentiles" de que habla Pablo, o los "cananeos" que cita Mateo son llamados a adorar en oración al verdadero Dios. Al escuchar las lecturas de hoy, tal vez nos sintamos tentados a preguntarnos: ¿Por qué rezar? Es una pregunta retórica; se equipara a preguntar por qué han de hablarse los amigos o los enamorados besarse. Rezar es una manera de relacionarnos con Dios, una manera de hablarle. Los apóstoles tuvieron la oportunidad de conversar en persona con Jesús encarnado. Nosotros tenemos la oportunidad de hablar con Dios en la oración. Nuestra relación con él debe ser entusiasta; no puede ser pusilánime. John Donne, un poeta y sacerdote inglés del siglo XV, supo cuáles eran las cualidades de una buena oración. Donne le pide a Dios que lo trate de manera diferente que a la mayoría de los cristianos. El poeta no quiere que Dios meramente "golpee, aliente, brille y repare", sino que también "rompa, sople, queme y me haga nuevo" (*Holy Sonnets*, XIV).

Se requiere una fe dinámica de nuestra parte para venir a Dios en oración. Como dijo Jesús una vez: "Toca a la puerta y se te abrirá" (Mateo 7:7). Tal vez requiera golpear la puerta hasta tumbarla, pero si perseveramos al igual que la mujer del Evangelio de hoy, veremos los resultados.

The Week Ahead



Last week, I wrote about YOU inviting people to come to one of the three sessions on either “coming into” the Catholic Church or “returning to” the Catholic Church. I am reminded of a true story that I have told before during a homily:

When the ‘late’ Bishop Norm McFarland was bishop of the then combined diocese of “Reno/Las Vegas” he lived in the episcopal residence in Reno. A housekeeper woman nicknamed “Charlie” had worked for two bishops before Bishop McFarland, namely, Bishops Robert Dwyer and Joseph Green. Bishop McFarland noticed that Charlie attended Mass every Sunday morning at the St. Thomas Aquinas Cathedral in Reno, but never received communion. After about a year of noticing this, Bishop McFarland asked Charlie why she didn’t ever receive the Eucharist. She replied that she wasn’t Catholic. When Bishop McFarland asked her why she wasn’t Catholic, her answer was: “...because nobody ever asked me to join the Catholic Church.”!!! ??? She worked for THREE Bishops and no one ever thought to ask her if she might be interested in Catholicism! Now I’m not suggesting that Charlie really thought she NEEDED a personal invitation, but perhaps she thought she wasn’t “worthy” or she just didn’t think she could or didn’t know how to start the process. The point is she was finally asked --- and within a few months, Bishop McFarland brought her into the Catholic faith: she still went to Mass and NOW Communion every Sunday.

Elementary Registration for 2011/12 year Grades 1-5 will begin July 5 in the Religious Ed Office M-Th 8:00 am - 4:00 pm and Friday 8:00am to 12pm. A BAPTISM CERTIFICATE is required for each child being registered.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Family must be registered at Christ the King
- Family must be worshipping at Christ the King at our weekend liturgy
- Past due balances from the previous Religious Education year must be paid prior to registering

When are classes held?

Classes are held on Wednesdays at either 4:00 or 5:45 pm

Fees:

- Religious Education Classes \$75.00 per child.
- First Holy Communion \$125.00 per child.
- Full Initiation \$150.00 per child.

\$25 non-refundable deposit is required to register. Payment plans are available.

SACRAMENTS

(1st Communion, Baptism)

REQUIREMENTS:

- Same as for Religious Education Registration plus:
- Child is in second grade or above
- Child is enrolled in and attending weekly age-level Religious Education classes on a regular basis
- Unbaptized children must attend one full year of Religious Education first

Our sacrament preparation is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and a parent or guardian in monthly sessions.

Attendance at these sessions is mandatory.
