

#### DIRECTION

Isaiah tells us something that we already know, and yet seem to forget every now and then. He tells us, essentially, that God is God and we are not. When we're confused and troubled and can't figure everything out, it might be wise to recall Isaiah speaking on the Lord's behalf and explaining that God —who is on a much more, well, Godly wavelength than we are — moves in ways we can't even imagine.

Saint Paul, by comparison, has everything figured out. Kind of. At least he



understands his calling in life — to magnify Christ in everything he does. That should give all of us the direction we need. Jesus gives us direction, too, explaining to us once again in the parable of the workers in the vineyard that the last will be first, and the first, last.

Jesús también nos marca el camino, explicándonos una vez más en la parábola de los viñadores que los últimos serán los primeros, y que los primeros serán los últimos.

#### **The Week Ahead**



Today is the last of 3 special inserts about the changes in the Mass. These changes will become official on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011.

We will begin to 'practice' these changes over the next several months. In

fact, some of the changes in music have begun already. It may not be immediately obvious as we sing some of the Mass parts – like the "Glory to God" or the "Holy, Holy". Often when a spoken response is set to music, there is some liberty to change the wording or phrasing to make it more musically pleasant and "singable". Parishes have permission to begin using the new musical settings in September in order to give the congregations a few months "prep" time so that by Advent we can sing well the new parts of the Mass.

Although we cannot "officially" use the spoken parts until that First Sunday of Advent, it will be necessary to "practice" them nevertheless. We will do so over the next several months – during the announcement time, that is, at the end of the Mass. At first, it may seem difficult to change "old" habits; for, in fact, we have been using these prayers and responses for over 40 years.

There are several reasons to have such a change: 1) the first English translation was as not as faithful to the "official" Latin text as it should/could have been. Other modern languages were more faithful. For example, the Latin response is "Et cum spiritu tuo" which was translated in English to "And also with you"; it will now be rendered: "And with your spirit". In Spanish, the translation has always been more accurate with: "Y con tu espíritu".

2) the new translation uses more direct Scripture quotes; for example, the Communion response will be "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word

and my soul shall be healed." This is a direct quote from the centurion who told Jesus that he did not have to come to his home to heal his servant (Luke 7:6).

I'm looking forward to this opportunity to study anew our liturgy. Often when we have done something so routinely for so long, we take its beauty and meaning for granted; so this new translation is a real gift to us. Let us welcome it.

#### THE NEW ROMAN MISSAL

Over the past two weeks we have been introduced to the concept of change in the liturgy as well as given some explanation as to the "why" and "how". The bulletin insert this week gives the actual revised texts for the peoples' responses as well as the wording we use now, so you can see the changes for yourself.

You will notice some of the changes are minor and some more major. Over the next few months prior to November 26/27<sup>th</sup>, we invite you to read over the revised responses and prayers. Sit with them in prayer and let yourself be opened to the Holy Spirit. Let the words become more a part of you, a part of your prayer at mass.

All of us will no doubt stumble and have to use the worship aid at mass for several weeks or perhaps months until we learn the revised texts, but be assured that just as each of us learned the responses and prayers before, we will learn them again. They will become second nature to us as the liturgy will hopefully become a source of new life and a renewed spiritual experience for us.

Elementary Registration for 2011/12 year Grades 1 -5 will begin July 5 in the Religious Ed Office M-Th 8:00 am - 4:00 pm and Friday 8:00am to 12pm. A BAPTISM CERTIFICATE is required for each child being registered.

#### **REQUIREMENTS:**

- · Family must be registered at Christ the King
- Family must be worshipping at Christ the King at our weekend liturgy
- Past due balances from the previous Religious Education year must be paid prior to registering
