The Week Ahead



I'm writing this column from my hotel room in Washington, D.C. on the morning (Wednesday, October 5) of my 40th Class Reunion. This reunion is for the Ordination Class of 1971 from Theological College (TC) at The Catholic University of America (CUA or CU). I actually was a student at TC for 5 1/2 years: 1964 -- 1967; 1968 -- 1970; and

the Spring Semester of 1971. Theological College is a seminary on the campus of Catholic University in NE Washington; on CUA's campus is also the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception (where our Alumni Mass is being held tonight). The seminary is staffed by the Sulpician Fathers, an order of diocesan priests whose main ministry is the formation of future priests (seminarians). Prior to attending TC at CUA, I went to a seminary, St. Joseph's High School/College, in Mountain View, CA, (near San Francisco) for four years (last two of high school and first two of college); St. Joseph's College was also staffed by the Sulpicians. For the school year of 1967 -- 1968, I lived at the North American College (a seminary for U.S. students) right next to Vatican City and took classes at the Pontifical Gregorian University (a Jesuit institution) in downtown Rome (near the Trevi Fountain). For the Fall Semester of 1970, I studied all over Europe (Germany, France, Belgium, the Netherlands and England) to write my dissertation. So my eleven years of seminary education were certainly exciting: San Francisco, Washington, D.C., Rome, Munich, Paris, Louvain (Belgium), Nijmegen (the Netherlands) and London! Exactly half of those 11 years were spent in DC at Catholic U; so I consider my time in Washington the most extensive part of my seminary formation and from those years I have maintained some of my longest and best friendships. That's why it is so good to be back in the District to renew friendships from TC and to enjoy the specialness of our Nation's Capital. On Monday, I saw many of the great monuments: Vietnam, Korea, Washington (with men climbing up and down doing inspections for damage from the recent earthquake), Lincoln (my favorite) and the newest: Martin Luther King, Jr. (awesome!!). Today, before our Reunion Mass and Dinner tonight, a group of us are going to the 9/11 memorial at the Pentagon. So, Washington is full of memories from over 40 years ago and yet is always new -- like the most recent additions; MLK Monument and Pentagon 9/11 Memorial. I'm very happy and honored to have lived here for all those years and to return. God bless America!

LITURGY CORNER

LITURGICAL PRAYER AND PERSONAL PRAYER

When we think of *prayer* and its definition we tend to think in terms of *personal* prayer rather than *liturgical* prayer. Is there a difference between private and liturgical prayer? The answer is a resounding YES, especially in light of the revised texts of the Roman Missal. In our personal prayer we communicate with God in an informal way with the words we use. God knows us and there's nothing we can hide from Him. There's no pretense and in that relationship our words are common and straightforward. Outside of certain traditional prayers such as the *Our Father* and *Hail Mary* we talk with God as if having a conversation with a friend. We don't speak in poetic forms or sentences that might be difficult to understand.

In the prayer of the mass it is just the opposite. The Presider, on our behalf offers prayers of thanksgiving, intercession and supplication in words that are much more formal. This might be a bit "off putting" to some, but it is done for several reasons, not the least of which is to heighten our awareness that we come together as a community, as a people of God, in His praise. Because of its' very nature, the liturgy demands a more "formal" use of words. This "formality" is not meant to create a distance between ourselves and God but to show proper respect and to lend the liturgy the dignity and the sense of mystery it deserves.

In the revised translation of the Roman Missal we will notice words and phrases we've been accustomed to hearing as being eliminated or changed. These changes are "truer" to the meaning of the original Latin texts and in many cases, the revised wording calls us to a deeper understanding of the depth and beauty of the prayers being offered.

For example, in the first Eucharistic prayer the text currently says: "We come to you, Father, with praise and thanksgiving, through Jesus Christ your Son. Through Him we ask you to accept and bless these gifts we offer you in sacrifice. We offer them for your holy catholic Church, watch over it, Lord and guide it; grant it peace and unity throughout the world. We offer them for N. our Pope, for N. our Bishop, and for all who hold and teach the catholic faith that comes to us from the apostles."

The new translation states: "To you, therefore, most merciful Father, we make humble prayer and petition through Jesus Christ, your son, our Lord: that you accept and bless these gifts, these offerings, these holy and unblemished sacrifices, which we offer you first of all for your holy catholic Church. Be pleased to grant her peace, to guard, unite and govern her throughout the whole world, together with your servant N. our Pope and N. our Bishop, and all those who, holding to the truth, hand on the catholic and apostolic faith."

Clearly there is an expanded and much deeper meaning to the revised texts.

Over the next few weeks we'll continue to examine some of these revised texts. Consider sitting with them, pray over them and ask God to keep you open to the Holy Spirit in the process of preparing yourself for the first Sunday of Advent when these revisions will go into full use. Have a blessed week!

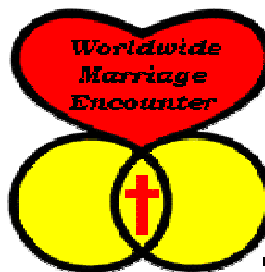

REQUIREMENTS:

SACRAMENTS
