IN GOD ALONE

Isaiah speaks to us today of Cyrus, King of Persia, anointed by the Lord. God calls Cyrus by name and leads him in service to the Israelites. In this passage we hear that it is the Lord who gives Cyrus his title, who arms him against his enemies, and who opens doors and unbars gates before him. And God does all of this so that the people will know that "I am the LORD," and that "there is none besides me" (Isaiah 45:6).

Paul opens his letter with essentially the same notion—that in God alone we find our grace and peace. Paul also gives thanks to God on our behalf, calling to mind our work of faith, hope, and love. And in the familiar Gospel reading, Jesus tells the Pharisees to give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's.

SÓLO EN DIOS

Isaías nos habla hoy de Ciro, el rey de Persia, ungido del Señor. Dios llama a Ciro por su nombre y lo conduce a servir a los israelitas. En este pasaje oímos que es el Señor quien le da a Ciro su título, quien lo arma contra sus enemigos, y quien abre los portones, y no deja nada trancado ante él. Y Dios hace todo esto para que su pueblo llegue a saber que "yo soy el SEÑOR," y que "no hay otro" (Isaías 45:6).

Pablo abre su carta esencialmente con la misma noción, que sólo en Dios podemos hallar gracia y paz. Pablo también da gracias a Dios en nuestro nombre, recordando nuestro trabajo fatigoso de fe, esperanza y amor. Y en la familiar lectura del Evangelio, Jesús dice a los fariseos que den al César lo que es del César y a Dios lo que es de Dios.

Forty two years ago, Fr. Louie Vitale, ofm, and several other Franciscan Friars were invited by the bishop to move to the Westside of Las Vegas to work with the poor. Later, sisters from different religious communities joined the friars. This prayerful, dynamic community devoted themselves in service to the homeless during the 1970s and 1980s. Out of the dust of these endeavors, Brother David Buer rented property to create the first Poverello House, a daysite for the homeless where they can shower, launder clothes, eat a hot meal with friends, and get mail. LITURGY CORNER

PRAYER OF THE PRESIDER AT MASS

One of the differences we will notice when the third edition of the Roman Missal will be used beginning the first Sunday of Advent this year is that the Presider (Priest) will be praying unfamiliar words that we aren't used to hearing. Some of the sentences might seem a bit "run on" or have too many words. The new translation of the Roman Missal will be truer to the original Latin texts and in doing so, the grammatical structure might seem a bit odd to us. Over time we will become accustomed to hearing the words, be attuned to the phrases and won't give it a second thought.

In a "sneak peak" of the "**collect**" for the first Sunday of Advent, which we have known as the opening prayer in the old sacramentary, the Presider will pray the following words: "*Grant your faithful, we pray, almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ with righteous deeds at his coming, so that, gathered at his right hand, they may be worthy to possess the heavenly kingdom. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.*"

In this prayer we encounter the vivid image of we, the faithful, **running** to meet God, a God who comes to meet us on the way. This way is in fact our Christian journey, a daily running of the race spoken of by St. Paul in the scriptures. Through our righteous deeds and all the things we consciously do as followers of Jesus Christ, we work toward possession of the kingdom of heaven for ever.

So much more can be said about this particular prayer. If ten people were asked to pray on the words there would be ten different interpretations. This is but one short reflection with all its richness and imagery offered to us. If we remain opened to the Holy Spirit, these prayers of the Roman Missal will become a great source of grace for us and our spiritual lives.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Unbaptized children must attend one full year of Religious Education first

Our sacrament preparation is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and a parent or guardian in monthly sessions.
