Con el paso del tiempo este fervor disminuyó un poco. CHANGE OUR LIVES

The letters of Paul to the Thessalonians are among his earliest writings, and are driven by his belief and the belief of the entire early Christian community that the return of Christ was imminent, and that devoting time or attention to anything else was foolish.

As time progressed, this fervor subsided a bit. Today we may wonder, when we hear these readings about the coming end-times, if we should take them to heart, if we really believe that Christ still may come upon us as a “thief at night” (1 Thessalonians 5:2). Does this mean that we are to stop our long-range goal-setting, get rid of our yearly calendars and planners, or stop putting money in the college education fund? Of course not. What it does mean is that we need to change our lives, living like children of the light and illuminating the world around us with the light of the gospel. Then, on that day, when the details of our daily living become unimportant, we will be ready to find our peace and security in Christ Jesus.

The Week Ahead



Next Sunday is the feast of Christ the King! This is especially significant for several reasons: 1) It is the last Sunday of the liturgical year; 2) and this year, it will be the last Sunday for the use of the texts that we have been using at Mass for 40 years from the book called the Sacramentary. (On the following Sunday, we will use — for the first time — the new texts of the Mass from the new book, the Roman Missal; 3) it is our feast day: Christ the King Catholic Community; and 4) it is the Sunday before Thanksgiving: our last weekend to bring in food for Thanksgiving Baskets.

I ask you, then, to read the column on page 5 and bring in those items next weekend, the feast of Christ the King. In the Gospel for this feast in Cycle A (2011), we hear Jesus saying: *“For I was hungry and you gave me food”* and *“. . . whatever you did for one of the least brothers (or sisters) of mine, you did for me.”* (Matthew 25: 35, 40.) This food will be used for the making of Thanksgiving Baskets — which will be distributed on Tuesday, November 22 . . . in time for the Thanksgiving holiday. I urge you to be generous! Thank you so much.

In case you haven't noticed, it is **COLD** outside (**brrr!!**) Well, all most of us have to do is put on our sweaters and/or coats; and we have warm homes and blankets for our beds . . . but that isn't true for everyone — especially the homeless, those living on our streets! For the last several years, a young man, a graduate of Bishop Gorman High School (Riley Foley), has organized a “Blanket Drive”. Once again, we will participate in this program. So, I'm asking you not only to bring food for our Thanksgiving Baskets, but also to bring in new or “nearly-new” blankets or sleeping bags for the homeless. Bring these in **NEXT WEEKEND** as well — the feast of Christ the King.

Speaking of sleeping bags and blankets, some of you lent to the Christ Renews His Parish teams from Toledo, Ohio, sleeping bags and blankets and pillows. Both women's and men's teams are grateful for your kindness; these are now stored in my office; please pick them up soon. If they are not picked up by mid-December, I will presume that they are a donation and I will add them to the “Blanket Drive” project.

LITURGY CORNER

Celebrating the Feast of Christ the King

This year our liturgical celebration for the feast of Christ the King on November 19-20th turns our focus to the scripture passage of Matthew 25: 31-46 ***“For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.”***

This is the same scripture that appears on the statue of Christ the King in our courtyard. Christ is barefoot, riding a donkey and there are figures of those hungry, imprisoned, marginalized on the fringes of society. It is to such as these that Christ, our King, calls us to serve here and now in the Las Vegas Valley.

In these economic times we don't have to look very far for people who need our help. In the spirit of serving one another, we ask that when you come to mass next week, in anticipation of celebrating this wonderful feast at mass, that you bring **extra food** for the hungry poor to not only fill our **manna cupboard shelves** but to also help fill the **Thanksgiving baskets** for those in need.

Secondly, we're asking you to bring **blankets** that will be collected and distributed to those living on the streets. These can be placed in the bins in the gathering space.

Come, let us in joy celebrate Christ our King. Let us make Christ's presence known not only in our liturgy but beyond the doors of the church. Let us **“be”** Christ for one another.

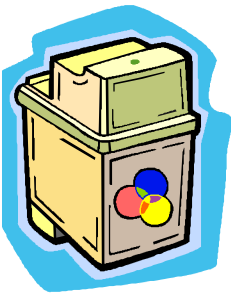

Baptism of older children *How do I enroll my child?*

Elementary Registration for 2011/12 year Grades 1-5 will begin July 5 in the Religious Ed Office M-Th 8:00 am - 4:00 pm and Friday 8:00am to 12pm. A BAPTISM CERTIFICATE is required for each child being registered.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Family must be registered at Christ the King
- Family must be worshipping at Christ the King at our weekend liturgy
- Past due balances from the previous Religious Education year must be paid prior to registering

When are classes held?

Classes are held on Wednesdays at either 4:00 or 5:45 pm

Fees:

- Religious Education Classes \$75.00 per child.
 - First Holy Communion \$125.00 per child.
 - Full Initiation \$150.00 per child.
- \$25 non-refundable deposit is required to register. Payment plans are available.**

SACRAMENTS

(1st Communion, Baptism)

REQUIREMENTS:

- Same as for Religious Education Registration plus:
- Child is in second grade or above
- Child is enrolled in and attending weekly age-level Religious Education classes on a regular basis
- Unbaptized children must attend one full year of Religious Education first

Our sacrament preparation is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and a parent or guardian in monthly sessions.
