Liturgy Corner

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord "Bring your Candles for Blessing" February 2, 2014

Next Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This feast recalls how Mary and Joseph, obedient to the Jewish law and tradition, brought the baby Jesus to the temple 40 days after his birth. This presentation in the temple also brought about an encounter between Jesus and two people: Simeon and Anna, mentioned in the gospel story for the liturgy.

Simeon and Anna had both, for years longed to see the coming of the Messiah, foretold by the prophets. It was at this presentation of Jesus in the temple that brought about the fulfillment of their hopes and dreams.

Jesus was from his birth associated with **light**. The "**light of Christ**" dispelled the darkness of sin in the world.

The early church developed a special feast in recognition of Jesus as the "**Light**." From the mid 5th century a candlelight procession has begun the liturgy for the feast, and a special blessing of candles, brought from the homes of the "faithful" was incorporated into the liturgy.

So, we invite everyone to bring their candles from home that they would like to be blessed. These candles can then be kept in a special place and lit for your private and family prayer times throughout the year.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The prayers surrounding baptism often speak of being “clothed in Christ,” and clothes are an important consideration. In ancient times, adults were probably baptized without any clothes at all, and old texts survive asking people to leave fancy garb and jewelry behind as they enter the font. Baptism was typically in a private place, the community waited elsewhere, and the casting off of clothing was hardly a public moment, nor was it embarrassing in ancient cultures where privacy was largely unknown. Nonetheless, what was left behind on one side of the font was replaced on the other as a white robe was wrapped around the newly baptized. It was a robe of honor, a dazzling sign of a new beginning for a society that valued clothing as a sign of personal identity. For the newly baptized, a whole week in white garments was the rule, through the second Sunday of Easter, called “Sunday *in Albis*,” because of all the folks wearing their baptismal robes.

REFLECTING ON GOD’S WORD

Imagine a large group of travelers, lost in the midst of a dense forest on a starless black night. They cannot see the path; they cannot even see each other. Little by little they wander in different directions, trying desperately to find their way forward through the immense trees, all the while spreading further and further apart. Suddenly a bright white lantern shines from the edge of the forest. Their fear flees with the darkness. As they head toward the light they rejoin one another and rejoice to discover the one way out of the forest.

The imagery of light in the darkness threads its way through the Sundays of Ordinary Time between Christmas and Lent. It reminds us that the Light of the World, whose dawning we celebrated during the Advent/Christmas season, is the same light of Christ whose flame will purify and enlighten us during Lent and enkindle the fire of the Holy Spirit in us during the fifty days of Easter.

This week our first reading likens the salvation of the “District of the Gentiles” to light dispelling darkness, anguish, and gloom. Matthew’s Gospel characterizes Jesus as a light arising in “Galilee of the Gentiles,” beckoning the fishermen to join together in following him along the way. Paul exhorts us to remain united on the one way that follows the light of our one and only Lord, Jesus Christ.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Esta semana recordamos la memoria de san Juan Bosco conocido como “Don Bosco”. Es curioso el apelativo de “Don” ya que es un título para nobles señores. En siglos pasados era el título común para un sacerdote diocesano, mientras que el título hermano se reservaba para sacerdotes y hermanos religiosos. En la Iglesia católica existen dos clases de sacerdotes. Unos son diocesanos o seculares quienes dedican su vida a la diócesis a la que pertenecen. Estos sacerdotes hacen voto de celibato y obediencia al obispo local. El otro grupo de sacerdotes son los que pertenecen a órdenes religiosas. Ellos viven en comunidad y hacen votos de pobreza, celibato y obediencia a su comunidad. En muchas partes a todos los sacerdotes religiosos o diocesanos se les llama “padre”. Este título fue usado en la Primera Iglesia y durante la Edad Media para honrar a hombres santos, ya fueran laicos o sacerdotes. Se les llamaba “padres” sólo cuando habían llegado a mostrar, con una larga vida, que podían animar a los demás con su buen ejemplo. Todos los sacerdotes debían vivir de tal manera que merecieran el título de padre, sin deseárselo directamente.

REFLEXIONEMOS SOBRE LA PALABRA DE DIOS

Imaginémonos un grupo grande de viajeros perdidos en medio de un bosque espeso y una noche sin estrellas. No pueden ver el camino, ni siquiera se pueden ver unos a otros. Poco a poco van deambulando en diferentes direcciones tratando desesperadamente de encontrar el camino en medio de árboles inmensos mientras que se siguen separando más y más. Súbitamente se ve la luz brillante y blanca de una linterna en los bordes del bosque. El temor de ellos se disipa con la oscuridad y al dirigirse hacia la luz todos se reúnen de nuevo, y se alegran al descubrir el camino que los sacará del bosque.

La imagen de la luz en la oscuridad es la fibra que va hilando todos los domingos del tiempo Ordinario entre la Navidad y la Cuaresma. Nos recuerda que la Luz del Mundo, cuyo comienzo celebramos durante el tiempo de Adviento y Navidad, es la misma luz de Cristo, cuya llama nos purificará e iluminará durante la Cuaresma y encenderá el fuego del Espíritu Santo en nosotros durante la cincuentena pascual.

Nuestra primera lectura de esta semana se asemeja a la salvación del “distrito de los paganos” para iluminar y disipar la oscuridad, la angustia y la pesadumbre. El Evangelio de Mateo personifica a Jesús como la luz que surge en la “Galilea de los paganos” y que atrae a los pescadores para que juntos se dispongan a seguirlo. Pablo nos exhorta a seguir unidos por el único camino que nos dirige al único Señor: Jesucristo.



The early church met in homes to celebrate and nurture their common faith. Doing that built their relationships and made them stronger.

We are a large and diverse faith community so it may be easy to "get lost in the crowd." That's why Small Church Communities are important to a parish like ours, which has experienced a lot of change, growth and challenge in recent years.

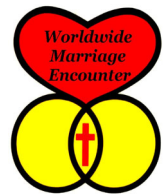

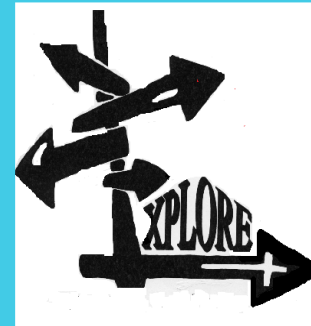

REQUIREMENTS:

- Family must be registered at Christ the King
- Family must be worshipping at Christ the King at our weekend liturgy
- Past due balances from the previous Religious Education year must be paid prior to registering

When are classes held?

Fees:

- Religious Education Classes \$80.00 per child.

SACRAMENTS

(1st Communion, Baptism)

REQUIREMENTS:

- Same as for Religious Education Registration plus:

- Unbaptized children must attend one full year of Religious Education first

Our sacrament preparation is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and a parent or guardian in monthly sessions.
