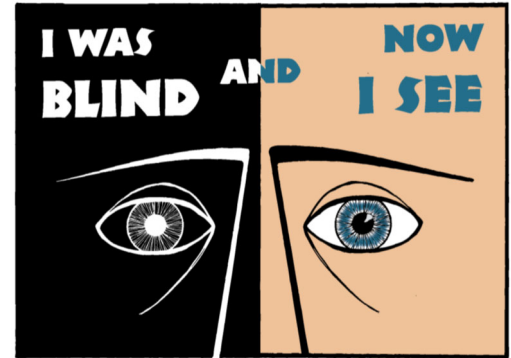

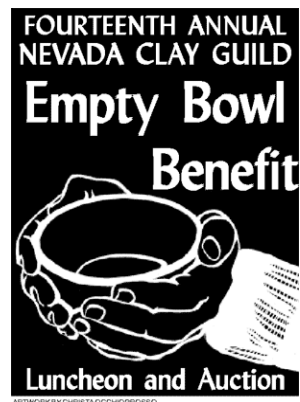

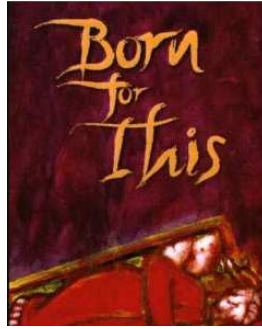

LITURGY CORNER

Lent – Week Four

*“Be STILL my love, know that I am God.
Be STILL my love, know that I am God.”*

This fourth week of Lent calls us to conversion from the “*blindness*” of our hearts, our judgments, our prejudices, all that hinders us from “*seeing*” the world and those around us with the eyes of Christ. We join with the “*elect*” preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil in looking at our lives and rooting out those things within that are stumbling blocks to our personal and communal holiness and wholeness. We pray God's blessings upon us as we continue our Lenten journey of faith.

RESPECT and REVERENCE (Part II)
(ARRIVING LATE and LEAVING EARLY)

Just a few words continuing the topic of **RESPECT** and **REVERENCE** for the liturgy that was the focus of our Liturgy Corner article last week.

When we come to the celebration of the Liturgy or attend a Wedding, Funeral, Quincenara or special prayer service at church we should be respectful of the Presider leading the service as well as those around us, within the assembly that is present. That means making sure we arrive **on time** for the service, and better still, come to church **early**, making sure we can get a parking spot, find seats in the church, have time to share with our friends before the service and ready ourselves for the celebration.

This has become an issue of great concern for us here at Christ the King. We fully understand that there are things beyond our control at times that can hinder a timely arrival at mass, especially when children are involved or work commitments for example, but please realize it is a disturbance to the Liturgy and the congregation when people come in to a service late. Unfortunately we are not talking about a handful of people, but as many as 50 – 100 or more that continually come into the church not only after the mass has begun, but even as late as 20 – 30 minutes or more into the service.

The opposite is also true: the numbers of people who **leave mass early**, before the celebration is complete. Again, we are aware of work commitments and other things that press upon our time but the numbers that exit especially after receiving communion are astounding!

During this Lenten season perhaps this is a great time to reflect upon our reasons for coming to mass. Do we come out of obligation? Do we really want to be here to celebrate the mass, to receive Jesus Christ in the Eucharist? Do we show the proper respect and reverence when we do come to church? Can we do better with getting to church on time and/or staying for the whole liturgy?

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

If there is such a thing as a Catholic “trademark” it is the sign of the cross, first traced on the senses of catechumens as they begin the journey to baptism, or on the forehead of an infant who is brought to the doors of the church at baptism. As early as the third century, Christians were tracing the sign of the cross on their bodies. At first, the cross was traced on the forehead during times of prayer and daily occupations. We use a similar small cross today as we trace the cross over on the forehead, lips, and heart at the Gospel during Mass. Much later, the full-body sign traced from forehead to heart to shoulders took shape, perhaps copying the priest’s gesture of blessing with the consecrated host during Mass. Today, this superb baptismal gift is a sign of belonging to Christ and the community, a way of focusing our attention, of asking for God’s blessing, of tracing on our shoulders a willingness to find meaning in life’s burdens. In the sign of the cross, we have an ever-available means of expressing gratitude for our baptism.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Hoy recordamos el nacimiento de uno de nuestros propios héroes: César Estrada Chávez, quien nació en Arizona en 1927 y falleció en Los Ángeles, California en 1993. El racismo y la injusticia de su tiempo, obligaron a él y su familia a salir de su natal Arizona, pues sus padres perdieron sus tierras a causa de unos malhechores. En 1938 el destino lo llevó a Los Ángeles, al barrio “Sal, si puedes”. Con la ayuda de Dolores Huerta y otras personas, en 1962 fundó el movimiento sindical de campesinos que daría a luz a *United Farm Workers* para protestar por las injusticias que nuestro pueblo sufría en los viñedos, situación que bien puede describirse como barbarie. De esta manera, con símbolos de nuestro origen indígena y religioso, César nos enseñó que “Sí se puede” salir adelante. En dos ocasiones, en 1972 y en 1988 respectivamente, debido a que algunos compañeros del movimiento querían incurrir en la violencia para salir adelante, César hizo un ayuno de 24 y 36 días respectivamente. 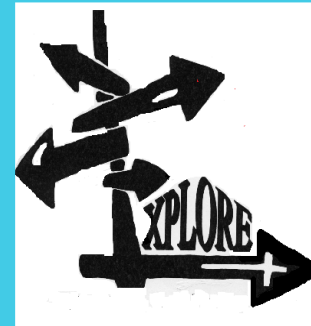

REQUIREMENTS:
