## November 1, 2015 ~ All Saints Day

### Today's Readings

**First Reading** — John's vision of a vast throng from every nation and people, whose robes had been made white in the blood of the Lamb (Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14).

**Psalm** — Lord, this is the people that longs to see your face (Psalm 24).

**Second Reading** — By God's love, we may be called God's children (1 John 3:1-3).

**Gospel** — The Beatitudes: your reward will be great in heaven (Matthew 5:1-12a).

### WE LONG TO SEE GOD'S FACE

"Lord, this is the people that longs to see your face." This antiphon for today's responsorial psalm offers the focus for today's readings. As we on earth celebrate the triumph of all the saints ... the ones officially canonized by the Church, and the countless others who have also reached heaven—we add nothing to their glory. But we give ourselves reason to hope. We too long to see the face of God and believe that we can one day be counted among those whose robes, as John tells us in the book of Revelation, are washed "white in the blood of the Lamb."

The passage from John's First Letter offers further assurance: we are God's children who will one day see God. But today's Gospel pulls us past longing and reassurance into action. Jesus clearly tells us what we must do to be counted among the saints. We must be poor in spirit, hungry for holiness, merciful, single-hearted, and peacemakers! Then we too will see the face of God.

Pero el Evangelio de hoy nos hace pasar del anhelo y la certeza a la acción. Jesús nos dice claramente qué debemos hacer para estar entre los santos. Debemos ser pobres de espíritu, misericordiosos, limpios de corazón, tener hambre y sed de justicia y trabajar por la paz. Entonces, nosotros también veremos el rostro de Dios.

## Treasures from our Tradition

Eight hundred years ago, the church's practice of penance underwent major revision as theologians, called scholastics, reflected on the practice of their day. By then, penance was normally a very secret rite, celebrated completely apart from the community. Public penance had mostly disappeared behind the walls of monasteries and the cloister grills of convents. The scholastics trimmed penance down to bare essentials, even sweeping aside age-old traditions like a laying on of hands and prayers of absolution. All that was left was the confessor's simple statement, "*Ego te absolvo*," "I absolve you."

In 1614 a new ritual book tried to make penance more public and solemn. It suggested, but did not require, that the priest wear a surplice and stole, and hear the confession in a confessional. For the first time, we have the directive that the priest be separated from the penitent by a screen, a rule that some bishops applied very strictly. By the 1940s, large numbers of Catholics availed themselves of the sacrament of confession every Saturday, and most people thought confession was a prerequisite for Communion. In some urban parish churches, confessionals were staffed, usually by the junior priest, for several hours every day, even during the celebration of Mass. It is remarkable how quickly things changed, but as we have seen, the system has collapsed before and what often comes next is an impulse of the Spirit, new life, and a fresh start. —Rev. ## God's Word Today

Gospel love is not about feelings. It's about choosing to care regardless of how we feel. It's about making decisions based upon the vision of Jesus regardless of how many other visions are demanding our allegiance. If we wait until we feel like loving, well, we may in fact never get around to loving. Gospel love is about the will without

paying any attention at all to the emotions.

In *The Road Less Traveled*, M. Scott Peck distinguishes between infatuation and love. Infatuation, he says, is when we allow all the walls that we have put up in order to protect ourselves to collapse and thus permit another to enter into the most sacred and vulnerable portions of our lives. We think that in such a way we are becoming one with another because there are no more walls to divide us, except that before long our walls begin to go back up one by one.

On the other hand, notes Peck, real love is not about collapsing our walls but about expanding them in never-ending fashion, thereby choosing to allow more and more people into the deepest portions of our lives. Real love is the choices we make and not feelings we experience. Once we begin to choose to live in such a fashion, says Jesus, we are not far from the kingdom of God.—Rev. Joseph J. ## Tradiciones de Nuestra Fe

En el Evangelio de san Mateo se encuentra el sermón más largo de Jesucristo. Abarca tres capítulos y contiene una serie de instrucciones para quienes desean ser sus discípulos. El famoso Sermón de la Montaña, es para Jesús y los cristianos lo que los Diez Mandamientos son para Moisés y los judíos. Jesús proclama la nueva Ley. La Ley de Israel se sintetiza en los Diez Mandamientos, mientras que la ley cristiana se resume en ocho bienaventuranzas.

Estas bienaventuranzas son algo extrañas ya que unen cosas completamente opuestas a la felicidad, y las beatifica. Es decir, son cosas aparentemente contradictorias: "Dichosos los que lloran"; "felices los pobres"; "bendito tú cuando te calumnien por causa mía". Jesús toma lo que la sociedad maldice y lo convierte en camino de bendición, porque nuestros caminos y pensamientos no son los de Dios. Dios ve mucho más de lo que

podemos ver o imaginar. Por eso las bienaventuranzas son ocho y no diez, porque más que una ley para cumplir, las bienaventuranzas son la esperanza de un nuevo día. Son la promesa de un nuevo inicio para la humanidad, gracias a Dios. —Fray Gilberto Cavazos-Glitz, OFM, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

## La Palabra De Dios

El amor del Evangelio no tiene que ver con sentimientos. Se trata más bien de ocuparnos en el servicio necesario a pesar de cómo nos sentimos. Se trata de hacer decisiones fundamentadas en la visión de Jesús a pesar de las tantas otras visiones que exigen nuestra lealtad. Si esperamos a sentirnos cariñosos, bueno, lo más probable es que nunca lleguemos a amar. El amor del Evangelio tiene que ver con la voluntad, sin prestarle atención alguna a las emociones.

En el libro *La nueva psicología del amor* (título original: *The Road Less Traveled*) M. Scott Peck hace una distinción entre el encaprichamiento y el amor. Dice él que el encaprichamiento es cuando permitimos que todas las murallas que hemos puesto para protegernos se derrumben a fin de permitir que otra persona entre en los rincones más sagrados y vulnerables de nuestra vida. Nosotros pensamos que de esa manera seremos uno con la otra persona, porque ya no hay murallas que nos separen, pero en poco tiempo nuestras murallas vuelven de nuevo a erigirse, una por una.

Por lo contrario, dice Peck, el amor verdadero no tiene que ver con derrumbar nuestras murallas, sino de ir las extendiendo en un proceso interminable, de manera que más y más personas puedan entrar en esos rincones íntimos de nuestra vida. El amor verdadero tiene que ver con las opciones que tomemos y no con los sentimientos que experimentemos. 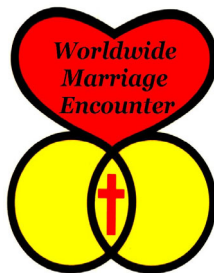

Our reflections on the Sunday scripture continue...Nuestras reflexiones del las Escrituras del Domingo continua...

### October 31/November 1 ~ (Feast of All Saints – 31<sup>st</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time)

Today, we recognize all the saints who have gone before us and who currently walk with us on our faith journey. In the gospel we hear the proclamation of the "Beatitudes." These "attitudes" or "ways of being" challenge us to live with the mind and heart of God. *Which beatitude challenges you the most at this time in your life? Is there a person who inspires you to live a more saintly life?*

### 31 de octubre/01 de noviembre (Fiesta de Todos los Santos – 31<sup>o</sup> Domingo del tiempo ordinario)
