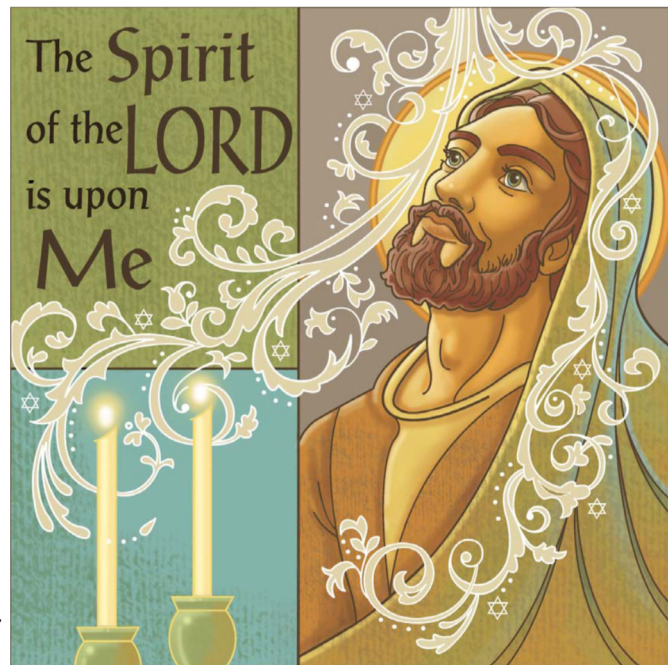

We can likewise know the joys and sorrows of the other members of the Body and share in them for the strengthening of the whole Body of Christ.

Algunas de las imágenes más conocidas y queridas de san Pablo se encuentran en los pasajes de la primera carta a los corintios que hemos escuchado la semana pasada y hoy: los muchos dones de un mismo Espíritu y los muchos miembros que componen el Cuerpo de Cristo. Pocos pasajes de la Sagrada Escritura resumen con mayor claridad cómo las vocaciones cristianas trabajan en colaboración.

A diferencia de otros escritos de san Pablo, producto de las convenciones sociales y religiosas de su época, estos nos permiten mirar nuestra propia vida y la vida de los que están a nuestro alrededor para discernir los dones, la vocación que el Espíritu Santo nos ha dado para el bien de todos. Así también podemos conocer las alegrías y las penas de los otros miembros del Cuerpo y compartirlas para así fortalecer todo el Cuerpo de Cristo.

Treasures from Our Tradition

As Roman Catholics, our marriage practices have their pedigree in ancient Rome. One of the major players in shaping our practices was the warfare involved in building an empire. Soldiers vanished and sometimes never returned. Women began to manage their lives and to make decisions. The old family values were replaced by patriotic ones, and religion was more attuned to the gore and glory of battle, a religion of the state, not of the family. Weddings were still family celebrations, but had a public face. The bride wore a white toga and a red veil and walked to her new home. There, she and her husband joined their right hands and gave consent to each other, not relying on her father to give consent for her. Religion was optional: a pagan priest might be invited or not, and even without the ceremony, society agreed by common law that a year of living together equaled marriage consent. By the same token, marriage by consent also meant divorce was on the same legal footing, and did not require the courts or civil declarations. This is the world-view the first Christians inherited, and it was up to them to determine what was good and to hold marriage up to the light of the gospel. —Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Rejoicing in the Lord

In the first reading, Ezra gets a strange reaction from the people to whom he reads the book of the law. First they lie down, with faces to the ground, and then they all are weeping. Remember the background of this reading. The people of Israel had returned from exile and needed to become a unified nation. Most had never heard the laws, so when they learned what was expected of them and realized how much of the Law they had broken, they wept from shame. Many probably didn't know that they had been breaking the law. Others might have been overwhelmed with all the requirements of the law. Ezra and Nehemiah console the people by reminding them that their return makes this a day "holy to the LORD" (Nehemiah 8:10). He adds that they would draw strength from "rejoicing in the LORD." That may

be good advice for us also. We might find ourselves so trapped in sin that we think we could never be forgiven. We need to remember that Jesus loved sinners so much that he gave his life on the cross to free us from sin. No sin can be so bad that God's love cannot forgive it. In other words, God's forgiveness is only limited by our failure to ask for it. As the psalms say, God's mercy endures forever. In fact, the more I have to repent, the more God wants to forgive. So we can rejoice in the Lord's forgiveness and the Spirit will give us the strength to change our lives.

And what about those who find the law overwhelming? That usually means a lack of faith in God's willingness to help us or in our ability to do the best we can to live as Christians. It can also be because we have forgotten Jesus' saying that all of God's laws are contained in the command to love God and love our neighbor as we love ourselves. Tradiciones de Nuestra Fe

El día 3 de febrero se celebra entre misas, mariachis, fuegos artificiales y muchas expresiones de religiosidad popular, la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de la Concepción de Suyapa en Honduras. Fue un sábado del mes de febrero, cuando Alejandro Colindres, un joven humilde labrador, y Jorge Martínez, un niño de ocho años, la encontraron.

Según la tradición estos llegaron cansados a la quebrada del Piligüín. Acostándose sobre el suelo, Alejandro sintió lo que le parecía una piedra en su espalda. Por más que intentaba arrojarla lejos, cuando se acostaba sentía la misma piedra. Por fin en lugar de tirarla, la puso en su mochila y al amanecer descubrió que no era piedra sino una pequeña imagen de María (6.5 cm.) con rostro indígena tallada en madera.

En 1780 se le construyó un templo y en 1796 se registró su primer milagro. El Papa Pío XII la proclamó Patrona de la República de Honduras en 1925. En las advocaciones latinoamericanas ella es nombrada como la fortaleza de los humildes. —Fray Gilberto Cavazos-Gluz, OFM, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Empezando de Nuevo

Se podría decir que Los Evangelios de Mateo y Lucas tienen dos inicios. Al igual que el Evangelio de Marcos, tienen relatos dramáticos del Bautismo del Señor (el relato que hubiéramos escuchado hace dos domingos si el calendario lo hubiera permitido). Esos relatos inauguran la misión pública de Jesús. Mateo y Lucas, sin embargo, escribieron un prefacio a sus Evangelios con el recuento de la infancia de Jesús. Notamos el gran cuidado que Lucas pone en su trabajo al ver una frase clave que aparece en ambos inicios de su Evangelio: "buena nueva". En la víspera de la Navidad, escuchamos al ángel proclamar la "buena nueva" del nacimiento de Jesús; hoy escuchamos al mismo Jesús proclamar la buena nueva para los pobres, los cautivos, los ciegos y los oprimidos. Nosotros también escuchamos que la venida de este ministerio será un año aceptable al Señor, lo que hoy llamaríamos un año de jubileo. Y aquí buscamos el modelo para nuestra propia vocación.

Empezar una Vocación Para la Vida

Lucas intencionalmente describe a Jesús para que les recuerde a la gente al profeta Esdras, erguido, orgulloso, abriendo el rollo para proclamar la Palabra de Dios. Esdras lo hizo cuando la gente de Israel empezaba una nueva era en su vida: la reconstrucción de Jerusalén y el templo después de su largo exilio en Babilonia. Jesús lo hizo al principio de una nueva era para todos los pueblos. El Evangelio de hoy suena como un principio -y lo es- pero un vistazo rápido a los pasajes que hemos escuchado nos mostrará que se omitieron tres capítulos del Evangelio. Hoy escuchamos a Jesús anunciar el principio más importante de su ministerio público: la irrupción de las curaciones y el perdón que el Espíritu lo ha ungido para traer al pueblo. Nuestra propia vocación en Cristo deberá siempre empezar así: no trabajamos solamente para edificar una nación o un reino terrenal, sino para edificar el Reino de Dios. Copyright (c) J. S. 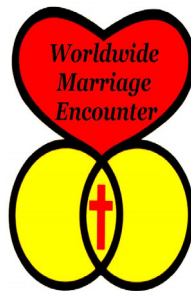

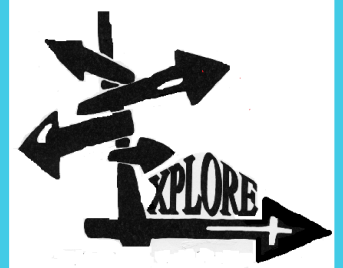

M-TH 8-4:00 pm - Closed from 12-1:00 pm
A BAPTISM CERTIFICATE is required for each child being registered.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Family must be registered at Christ the King
- Family must be worshipping at Christ the King at our weekend liturgy
- Past due balances from the previous Religious Education year must be paid prior to registering

SACRAMENTS

(1st Communion, Baptism)

REQUIREMENTS:

- Same as for Religious Education Registration plus:
- Child is in second grade or above

- Unbaptized children must attend one full year of Religious Education first

Our sacrament preparation is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and a parent or guardian in monthly sessions.
