## Today's Readings

### First Reading — In

a vision Isaiah is called to be a messenger for the LORD of hosts. Isaiah responds, "Send me!" (Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8)

**Psalm** — In the sight of the angels I will sing your praises, Lord (Psalm 138).

**Second Reading** — Paul reminds us of the gospel he preached through which we are saved, if we believe it (1 Corinthians 15:1-11 [3-8, 11]).

**Gospel** — Jesus directs Simon to take his boat into deep water for a miraculous catch of fish. Simon and his partners leave all to follow Jesus (Luke 5:1-11).

## HOLY, HOLY, HOLY!

"Holy, holy, holy!" Ancient languages, like the Hebrew used in the scriptures, did not always have a way to express superlatives in one word. Isaiah could not say God was "holiest," so he used the threefold repetition of the same word. This bit of scriptural minutiae about these "three little words" that we sing at every Mass serves as a reminder that answering God's call has to be grounded in awareness of God's holiness. In Isaiah and in the Gospel passage today, we hear accounts of the revelation of God's power and might: the seraphim in the temple and the miraculous catch of fish. These are not wondrous revelations for their own sakes. They lead to a response in mission, Isaiah's "Here I am, send me!" and the disciples' leaving everything to follow Jesus. And so must our own "Holy, Holy, Holy!" lead us to Christ in the Eucharist every Sunday, and to a life following him day by day.

## ¡SANTO, SANTO, SANTO!

"¡Santo, Santo, Santo!". Los idiomas antiguos, como el hebreo empleado en la Sagrada Escritura, no siempre tenían la manera de expresar superlativos en una sola palabra. Isaías no tenía una palabra similar a "santísimo", así que usó la triple repetición de la misma palabra. Este detalle de minucia bíblica sobre estas "tres pequeñas palabras" que cantamos en Misa cada domingo sirve para recordarnos que responder al llamado de Dios tiene que basarse en estar consciente de la santidad de Dios. En Isaías y el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy, escuchamos relatos que revelan el poder y la fuerza de Dios: los serafines en el templo y la pesca milagrosa. Estas no son revelaciones maravillosas sin razón. Dan lugar a una respuesta misionera, la de "Aquí estoy, ¡envíame!" de Isaías y la de los discípulos que lo dejan todo para seguir a Jesús. De igual manera nuestro "¡Santo, Santo, Santo!" nos lleva a Cristo en la Eucaristía de cada domingo, y a una vida de seguirlo día tras día.

## TIN CAN SUNDAY – LAST SUNDAY OF THE MONTH

We are beginning a new campaign at Christ the King. The last Sunday of each month, we are encouraging parishioners to bring a can of non-perishable food per household member to our Sunday services to benefit our food pantry. We will be doing this once a month on the last Sunday of the month. Our funding sources are unable to keep up with the supply and demand of the hungry coming to our pantry.

We ask you to generously remember to bring your can or cans depending on the number in your family starting Sunday, February 28<sup>th</sup>. We usually end up with a generous supply of canned vegetables and would like to encourage you to bring a variety of other foods, such as items containing meat, such as chili, stew, ravioli, soup, Vienna sausage and tuna. Quite often these supplies can be purchased much cheaper at some of the dollar stores here in town. Thank you for your generosity.



## PLEASE REMEMBER THE POOR BOX

Since July, we have spent \$16,083.42 purchasing extra food from Three Square Food Bank to augment our food supplies in our food pantry. In the same period, we have collected \$17,609.00 in the Poor Box which is located in the Gathering Space, on the wall near the Welcome Center. From this, you can see we rely greatly on your generosity.

Our food pantry is open in the parish office to persons living in the southwest part of town with no stipulations on their faith expressions. We serve Monday through Thursday mornings except holidays from 10:00 am until Noon. Food donated from parishioners at the altar and at the office during business hours, donations from Albertson's grocery stores, pizzas from Pizza Hut, and the Poor Box are our sole source of funding to operate.

Since the fiscal year began in July, we have served 1,570 households with 2,257 people. Thank you Christ the King Catholic Community for your generosity!

## Treasures from Our Tradition

As the Roman Empire shattered and collapsed, the bishops were the people best equipped to catch the falling stones. In the West (that's us), they sought to stabilize society by weaving a structure of laws and courts to uphold the rights and dignity of married couples in a chaotic world. The bishops in the East had a different approach, even allowing the dissolution of marriages in certain cases. To an extent, the bishops took a measure of control away from the fathers of families in order to provide pastoral care for those who suffered most in the social collapse: women and children.

In the West, much of the marriage law was contained in the "penitential books" the bishops devised to regulate the lives of public sinners. In the seventh century, Theodore of Canterbury's penitential book said that he had the power to give consent to remarriage in the case of a poor fellow whose wife had been carried off by the Vikings. If the Vikings subsequently brought her back, she could remarry, too! No bishop ever made peace with divorce, but there was never a time when the pastoral concern of the church was not struggling with how to care for people in unhappy situations. —Rev. ## Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time FIRST IMPRESSIONS

We talk about making a good first impression or falling in love at first sight. Today's scripture accounts reveal a little bit to us about first encounters that set in motion some very important scriptural lives. Isaiah has a momentous experience of God enthroned while the seraphim chant "Holy, holy, holy!" (Isaiah 6:3). Paul hints at his conversion and call to be an apostle when he refers to himself as one "born abnormally" (1 Corinthians 15:8), which is to say he is the only apostle—the "least," he calls himself—who did not know Jesus during his earthly ministry. We hear Luke's version of the first impression the disciples had of Jesus, when they learn an important lesson about being a follower of Jesus: you can labor all you want, but if you do not allow the Lord into your work, it will be in vain. When he enters, get ready to

be amazed.

## FINAL IMPRESSIONS

John, the only other evangelist to recount the story of the miraculous catch of fish, places the story after the resurrection of Christ from the dead, not at the beginning of his ministry as Luke does. Unlike Matthew and Mark, wherein the disciples follow Jesus upon his call, Luke seemed to know that his listeners would comprehend the call to discipleship better if it followed a miraculous sign. (And Peter's acknowledgment of his sinfulness echoes Isaiah's description of his unclean lips.) But whether it's Luke describing the beginning of the disciples following Jesus in mission or John's depiction of the risen Christ preparing his followers for the mission following his return to the Father, the point is the same, and remains the same for us today. Paul expresses it best. It does not matter who preaches the Gospel, or where or when, but only that it is, through the grace of God in us, preached and believed.

## Quinto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

### PRIMERAS IMPRESIONES

Hablamos de hacer una buena impresión o de amor a primera vista. Las Escrituras de hoy nos revelan un poco sobre los primeros encuentros que pusieron en marcha unas vidas importantes de la Biblia. Isaías tiene una experiencia transcendental de Dios en su trono mientras que los serafines cantan: "¡Santo, Santo, Santo!" Pablo nos da idea de su conversión y nos llama a ser un apóstol cuando se refiere a sí mismo como "un aborto", lo que quiere decir que él es el único apóstol -él mismo se llama el último- que no conoció a Jesús durante su ministerio en la tierra. Escuchamos la versión de Lucas sobre la primera impresión que los discípulos recibieron de Jesús", cuando ellos aprendieron una importante lección sobre cómo ser una seguidor de Jesús: ustedes pueden trabajar todo lo que quieran, pero sino dejan que el Señor esté en su trabajo, será todo en vano. ¡Cuando lo dejen entrar, estén listos para quedarse asombrados!

### IMPRESIONES FINALES

Juan, el otro evangelista que cuenta el suceso de la pesca milagrosa, coloca la historia después de la resurrección de Jesús de entre los muertos, y no al principio del ministerio como lo hace S. Lucas. Diferente a Mateo y a Marcos, que muestran a los discípulos siguiendo a Jesús, Lucas parecía conocer que sus escuchas entenderían mejor la llamada a ser discípulos si sucedía después de un milagro. (Y el reconocimiento por parte de Pedro que él es un pecador, nos recuerda la descripción de Isaías de sus labios impuros.) Pero, ya sea Lucas describiendo el inicio de los discípulos siguiendo a Jesús en su misión o la descripción de Juan del Cristo resucitado preparando a sus seguidores para la misión después de su retorno al Padre, el punto es el mismo, y sigue siendo el mismo para nosotros hoy. Pablo lo expresa mejor que todos. No importa quién predica el Evangelio, o cuándo y dónde, sino que es predicado y creído por la gracia de Dios en nosotros.

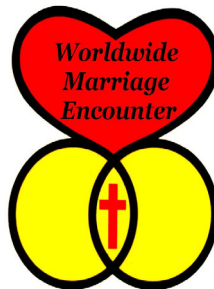

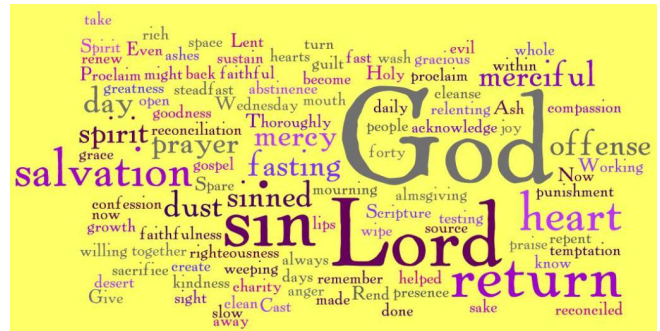
**Family Prayer Suggestions for February**  
Whoever is moved by love begins to perceive what "life" really is. He begins to perceive the meaning of the word of hope that we encountered in the Baptismal Rite: from faith I await "eternal life" -- the true life which, whole and unthreatened, in all its fullness, is simply life. Jesus, who said that he had come so that we might have life and have it in its fullness, in abundance, has also explained to us what "life means": "this is eternal life, that they know you those only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent" (John 17:3). Life in its true sense is not something we have exclusively in or from ourselves: it is a relationship. Life in totality is a relationship with him who is the source of life. If we are in relation with him who does not die, who is Life itself and Love itself, then we are in life. Then we "live".

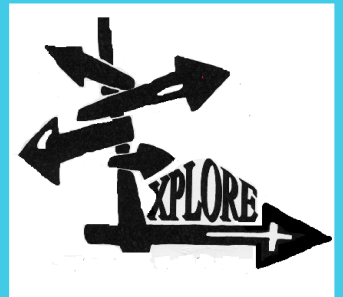
